When God instructed Moses to build the Tabernacle, He commanded, "whosoever is of a willing heart, let him bring . . . an offering to the Lord" (Exodus 35:4). The people of Israel brought generous offerings so that "the stuff they had was sufficient for all the work to make it, and too much" (36:7). God, who had given Israel all that they possessed, provided more than was needed. They were the channel through which God's provisions flowed.



Centuries later God instructed Solomon to build the temple in Jerusalem. God showed him the precise location. And He moved Hiram, king of Tyre, to provide cedar trees, fir trees and as much gold as Solomon desired with which to build the structure. Who could have guessed that vital building supplies would come from a foreign king? "The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD, as the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will" (Proverbs 21:1).

More centuries passed. The temple Solomon built was destroyed by Israel's enemies who subdued the nation because it forsook His Word. In captivity, "the LORD stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and put it also in writing, saying, thus saith Cyrus king of Persia, The LORD God of heaven hath given me all the kingdoms of the earth; and he hath charged me to build him an house at Jerusalem" (Ezra 1:1, 2). Again, God used a foreign king, pagan and superstitious, to build His house.

Ages continued to roll. For its idolatry, much of Israel was taken into captivity. A succession of captors came and went— Babylon, then Persia, then Greece and then Rome, each overtaken by its successor. The Roman emperor appointed Herod "the Great" to rule the Jewish region of his empire. From 20-19 BC, Herod rebuilt the temple on a grand scale, the temple from which Christ would drive the money changers and perform other works displaying His deity. Herod is known for many wicked atrocities, ordering the death of baby boys in Bethlehem among them. Yet he is the one God used to build Israel's temple in Jerusalem. Herod, who was not truly Jewish, and who was utterly set against God, was God's instrument for that task.
